Summit County and the Four Major Municipalities have each adopted false alarm ordinances requiring registration of intrusion alarm systems with the Communications Center if Law Enforcement response is desired. A valid permit is required after January 1 for police response to intrusion alarms.

OPTION #1 If you do not wish to have police response to your burglar alarm, you do not have to pay the registration fee. Please sign on the line below. In the Event of a Burglar Alarm, we will only call the list of numbers already provided by you , and remove your name from our alarm permit mailing list. When systems contain fire and/or panic alarms, those alarms are dispatched normally. Please return this form, you do not need to fill out the permit application or mail it back.

Thank you for your help and cooperation with this program. Because of you the program has been a success in reducing the amount of false alarms and making police response available when needed.

The summary of the ordinance is as follows, there is required a \$ 50.00 per year permit fee which provides for one false intrusion alarm response in a twelve month period. Alarm companies collect this fee and remit it to Summit County. Please make a separate check out to “Allied Security Group Permit Account” and use the envelope addressed “Allied Security Group – Permit Account”. Additional responses are \$ 75 for the second response, \$ 150 for the third, \$ 300 for the fourth and subsequent responses. Response may be suspended after the fourth response. A permit is not required for fire alarm, or panic alarm response, just intrusion alarms. An appeals process is provided.

Alarm Registration Form Instructions

Section I, This Section deals with Summit County information. Please write in the name of the business or last name of residence in Summit County. Please write the phone number of the premises in Summit County, as well as the Street Address and City. Put a check by the Alarm Types that apply to detection that exists in your home in Summit County. If you know your Alarm Panel Make or Model, list it, otherwise leave blank. If you know the date you started service or the system was installed, write it in under activation date, otherwise leave blank.

Section II, Please enter the first name and last name of the owner of the business or residence, Please enter two contact phone numbers for them. Please enter a mailing address, city, state and zip. If you have an email address, please enter it also. Check the box for a possible future paperless program if you would like to be able to enter and register on line directly with the counties web site at some point in time (not available yet). False Alarm Reduction Tips

What Allied Security Group, Inc. is doing to reduce false alarms – We are programming all new panels with false alarm reduction settings, including a grace period after an alarm sounds to allow the user to disarm the system without sending a false alarm, as well as a special signal that gets sent after an alarm to indicate a valid user code has been used to disarmed the system. Older system’s programming is being changed when we perform a service call. We have added second call verification to all our accounts. Customers that have a false alarm from a motion sensor and want to upgrade them to new technology false alarm reduction detectors can do so at a reduced cost (Free Service Call, just pay for the detector).

What You Can Do to Help – Make sure that all users of your alarm system know a correct arm/disarm code and Central Station password (#1 Reason for false alarms is a human operating error), Wipe cob-webs away from motion sensors, insects can cause a false alarm (#2 Reason for false alarms), Check all doors and windows and make sure they are securely latched and locked before leaving (#3 Reason for false alarms is improperly latched doors and windows), Don’t arm the system with the motion sensors on when a pet is being left behind (#4 reason for false alarms and #1 reason for unhappy pets). Back-up batteries are generally good for 3-5 years. They are rechargeable and run your system when the power is off. You may want to consider having your battery tested and changed if it is older than 5 years or you have experienced several long power outages. Panels may power down during a power outage if the battery goes dead, and may power back up and cause a false alarm. Consider adding a requirement for two separate devices to alarm before we dispatch the police. We will still call your call list if just one device alarms, but it is unlikely that two devices will false alarm at the same time. This option may not detect all intruders, but no security system will. Make sure your system has multiple devices to alarm and verify each other if you choose this, such a doors and motions. Some systems do not.
